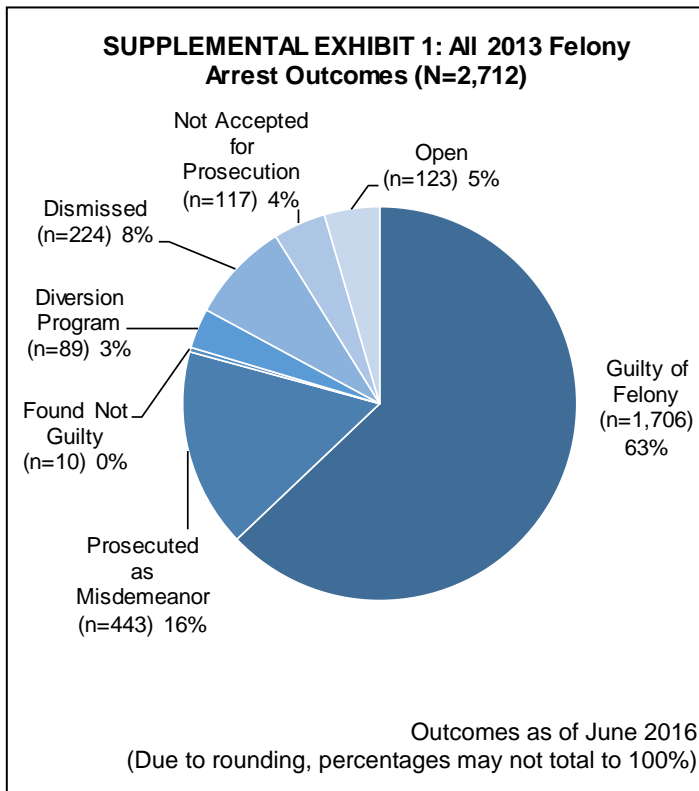

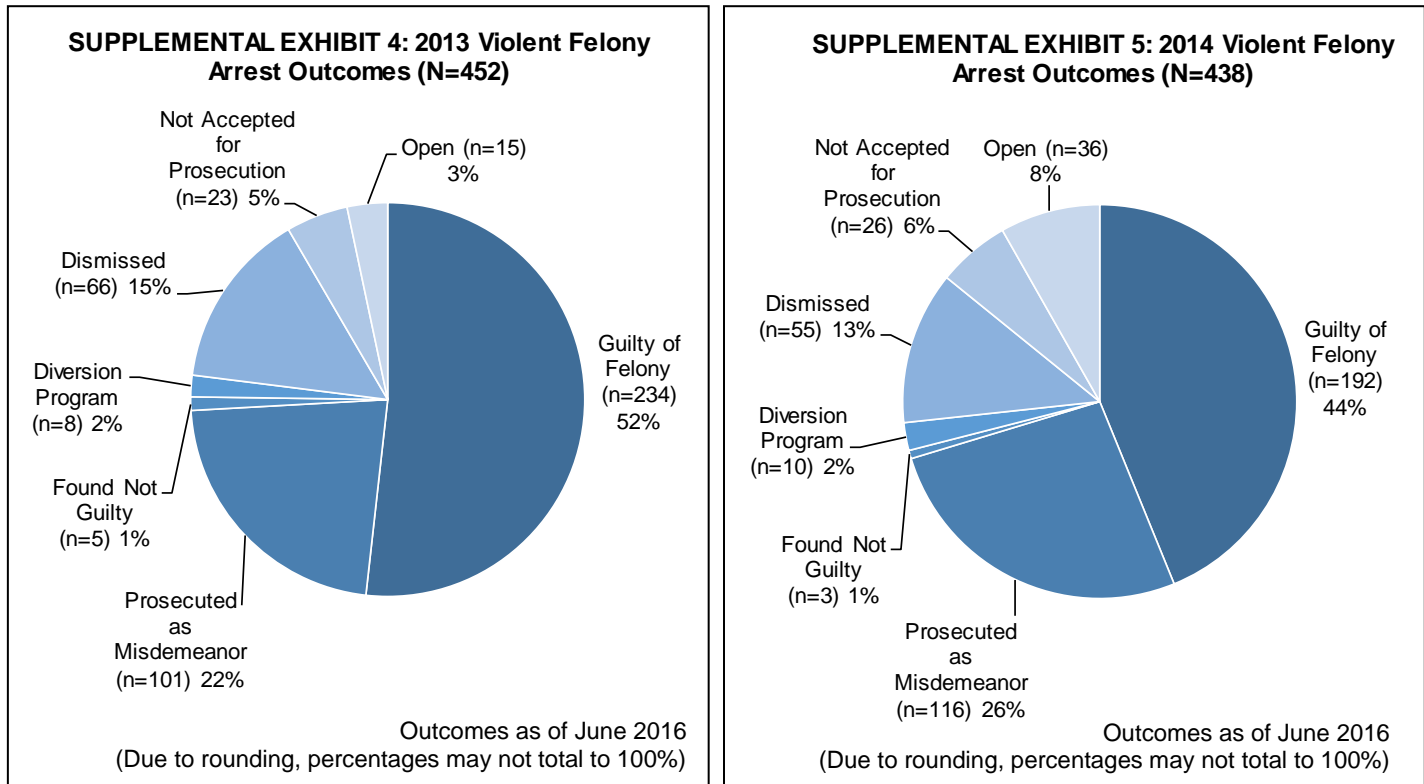

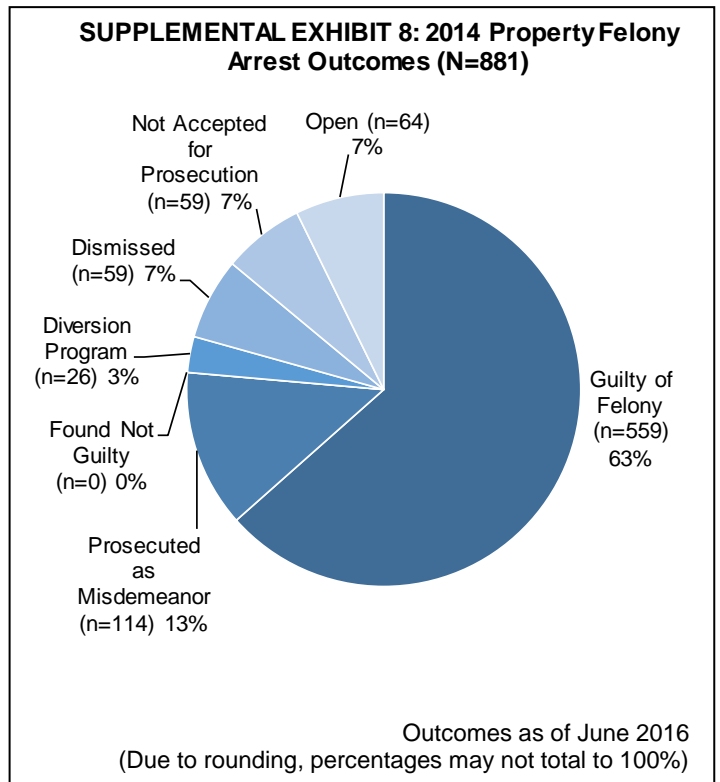

2013-2014 PROPERTY FELONY ARREST OUTCOMES



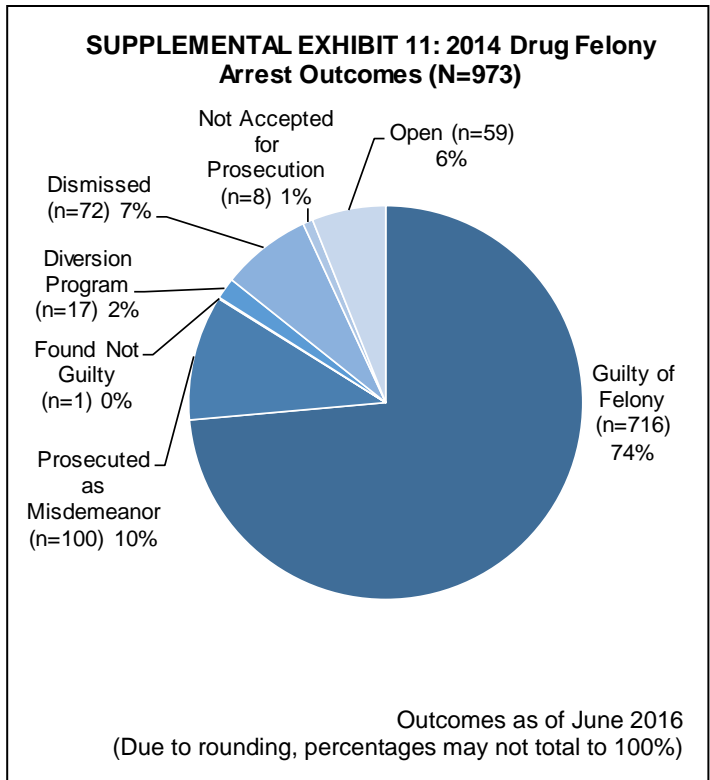
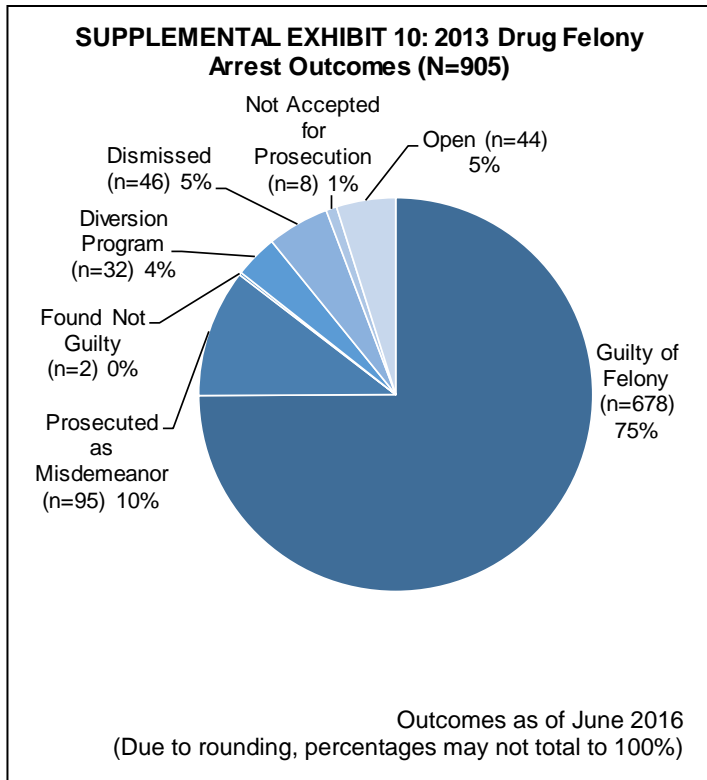

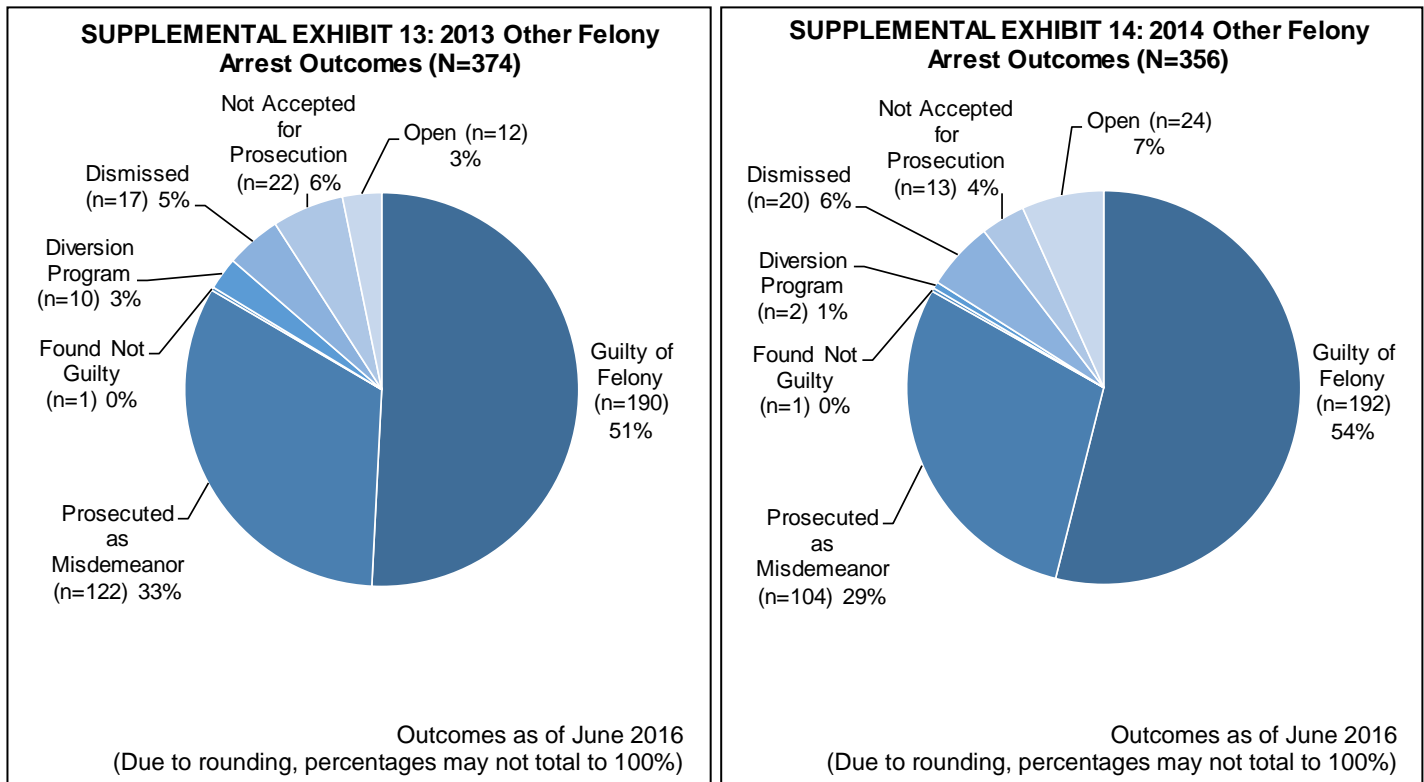

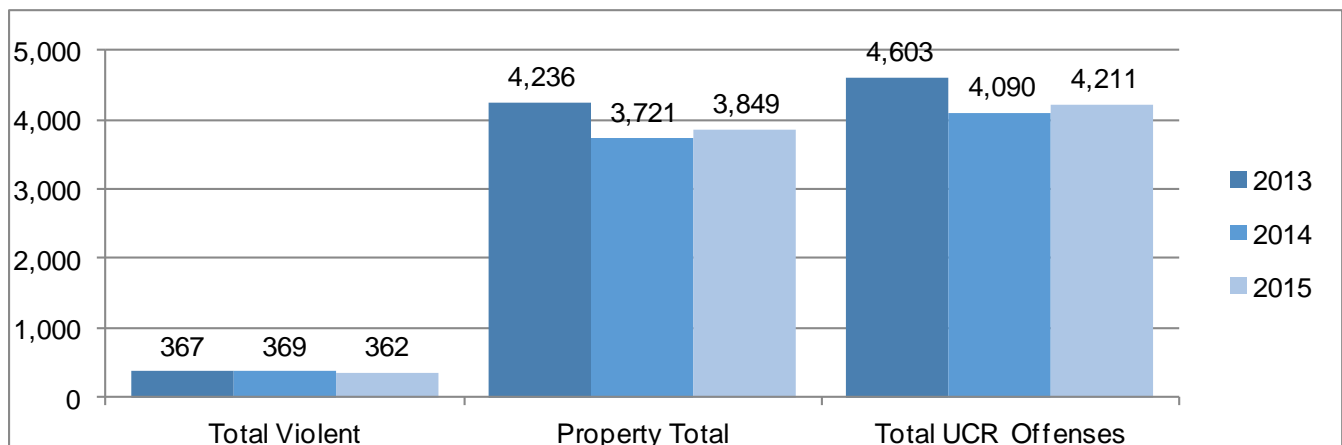
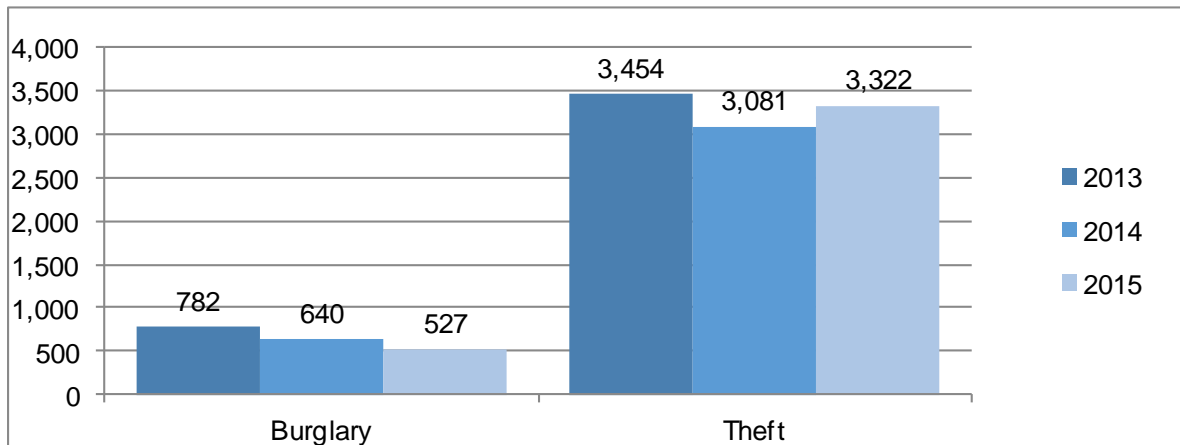
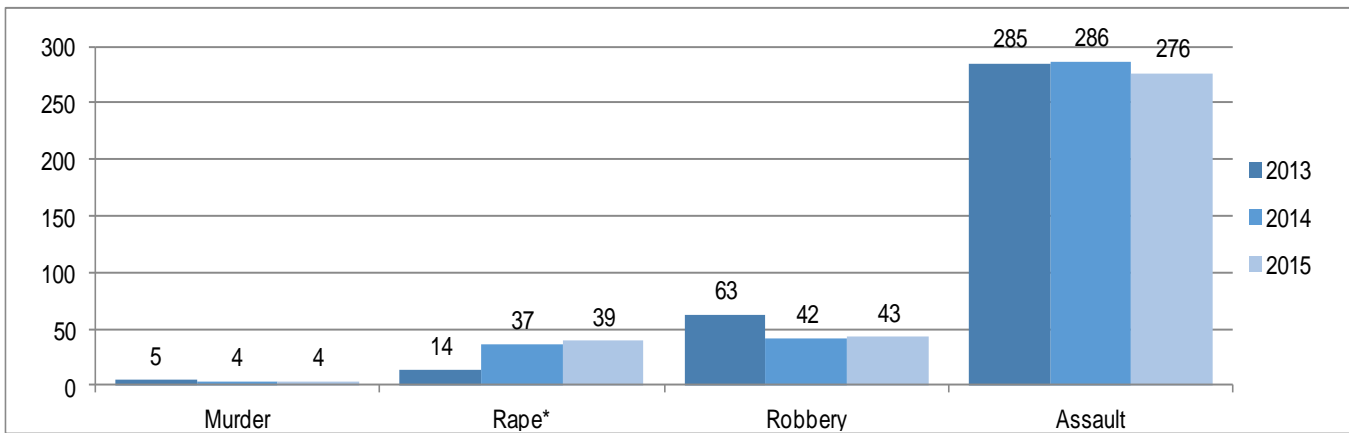

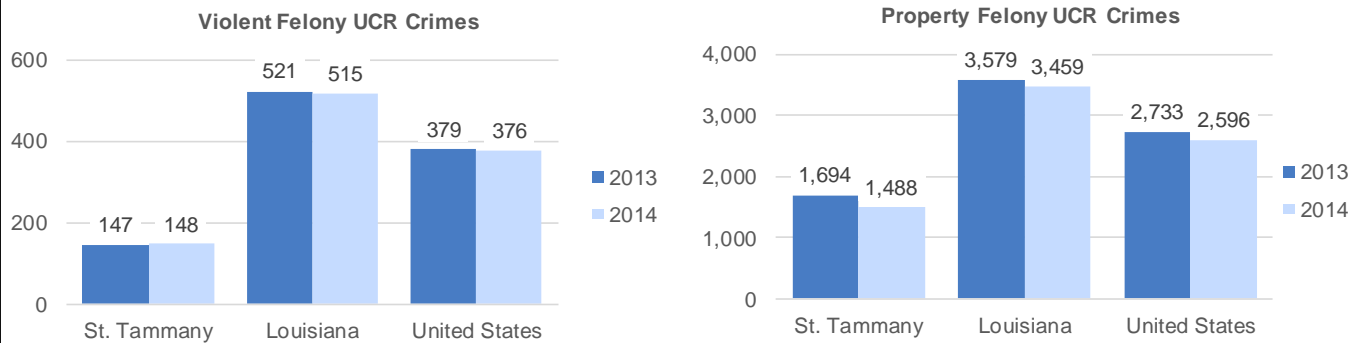

 Uniform Crime Report (UCR) Crimes 2013 – 2015**



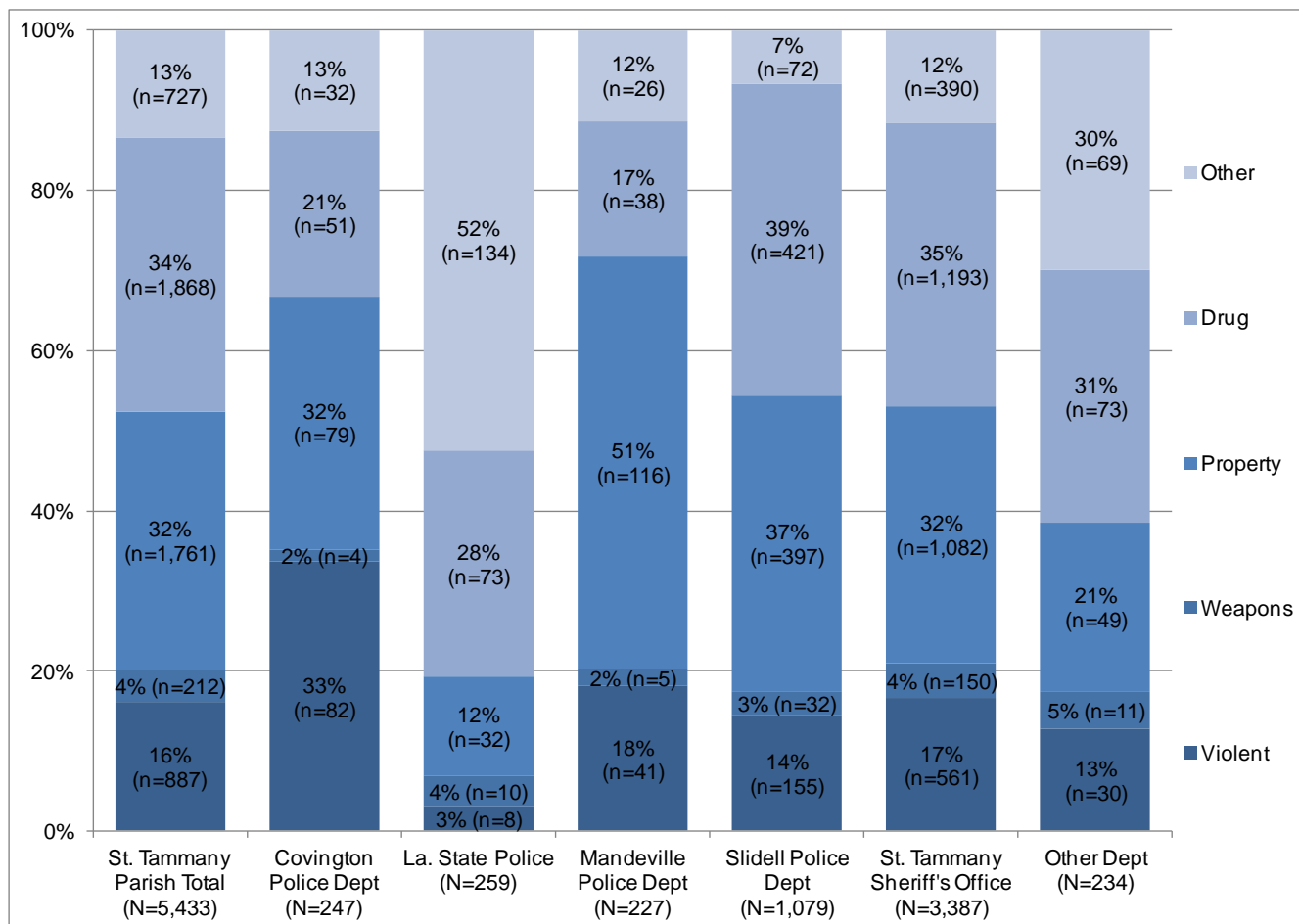

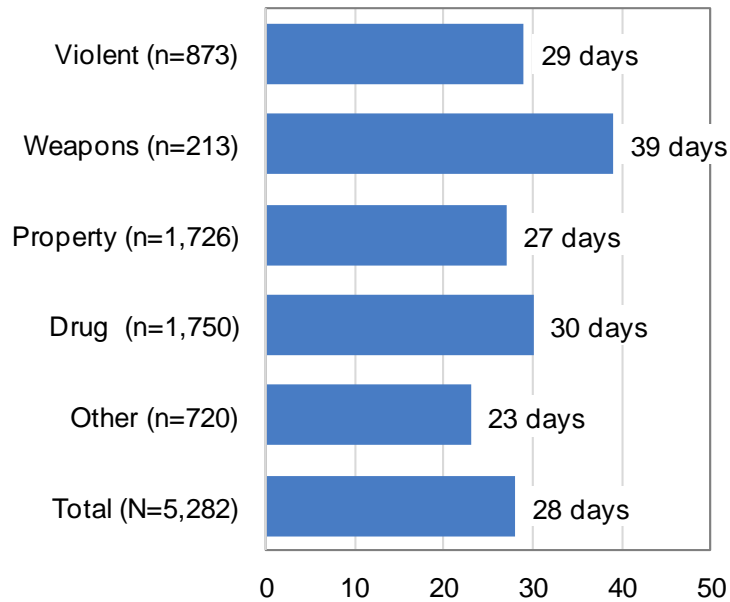

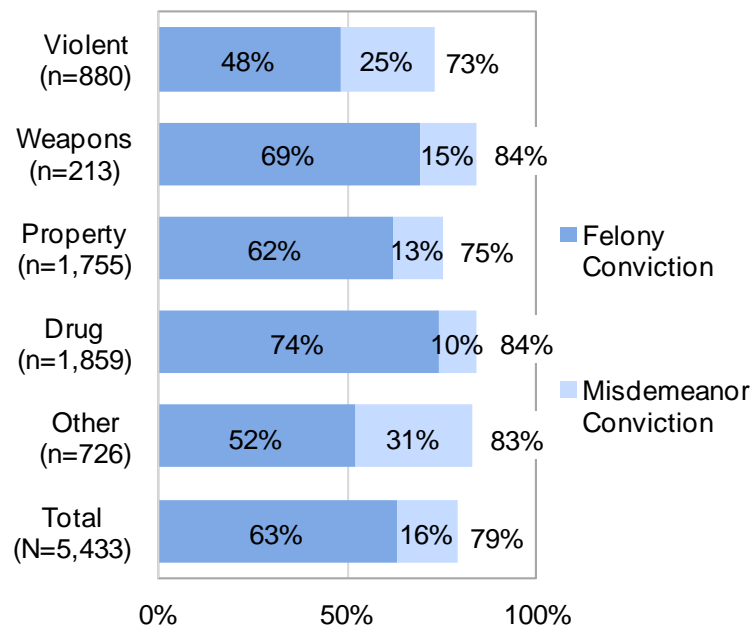

SUPPLEMENTAL EXHIBIT 19: St. Tammany Total Median Arrest to Police Referral – 2013 & 2014 Combined



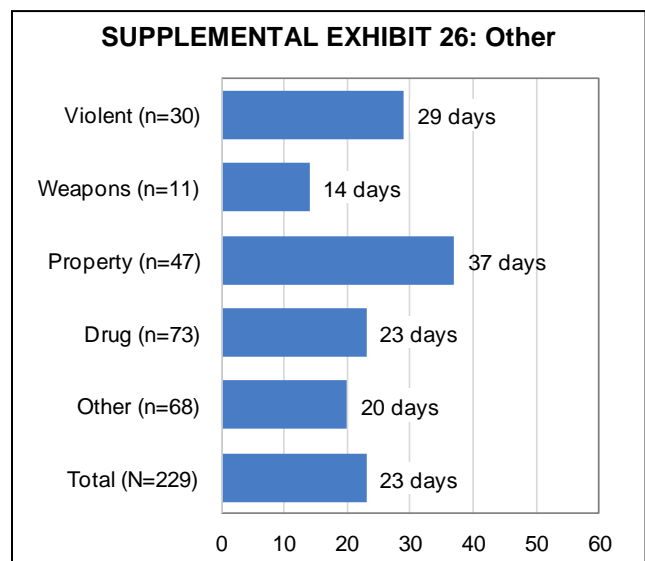
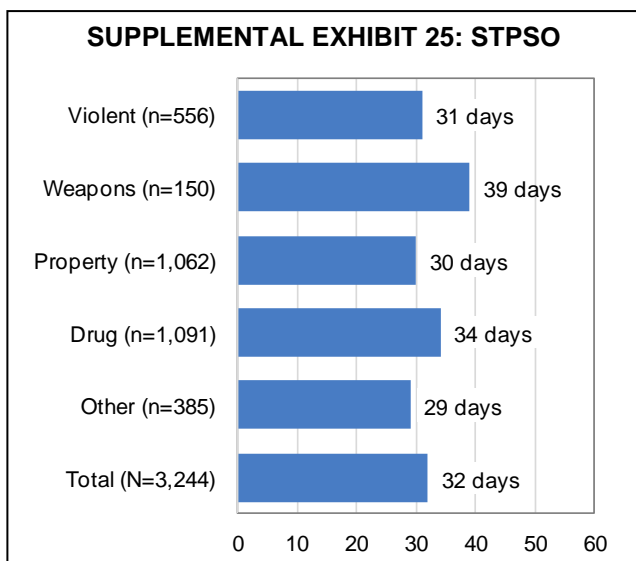
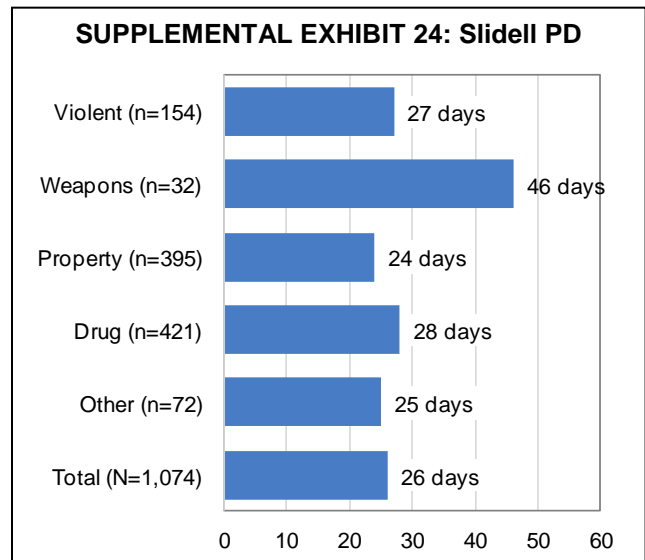
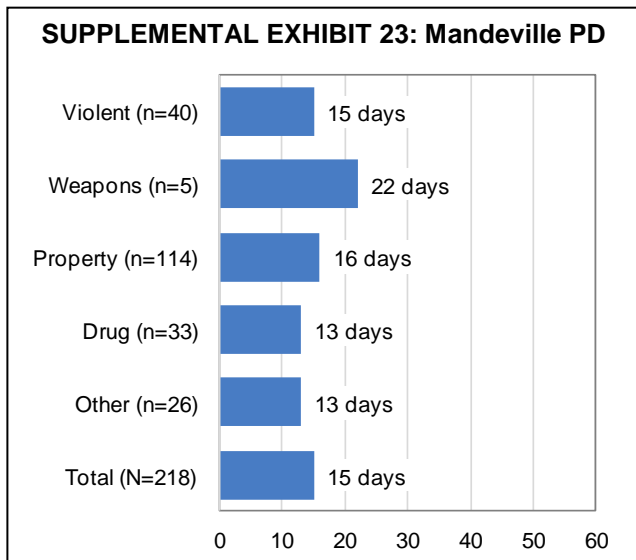
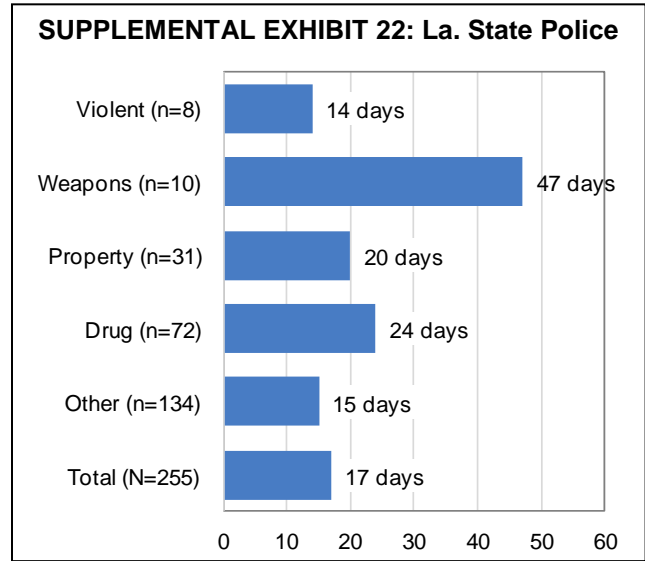
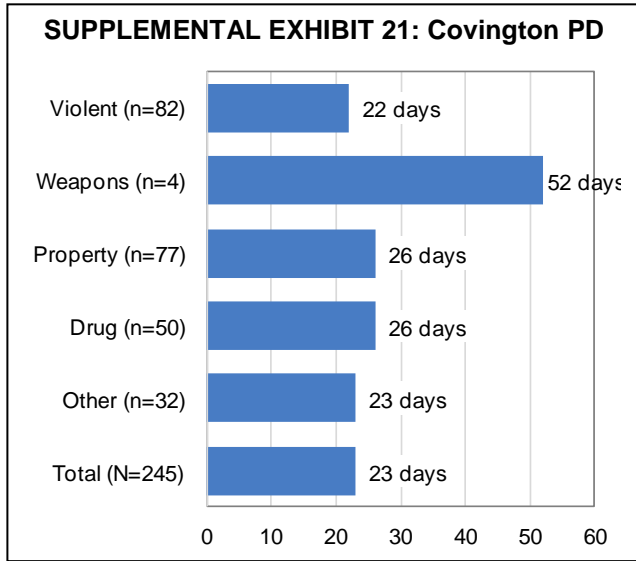
